Recovery is progressing much more quickly this time. It is just a little over two weeks after surgery, and I am starting to walk in the house without the walker for short distances. The home therapist has been very pleased with the progress. I need to know what the doctor thinks, and that appointment is this coming Friday. One question I will have is how to plan for the future. I want to send an update letter out after that.

There are reports of economic problems in Haiti right now. Many people are discouraged about the spiraling cost of living. Medications are not always easy to find or affordable. I will not be able to adequately assess the situation until I return.

8 February 2019 First post-op visit to the doctor

The visit to the doctor today went very well. I no longer need to use the walker, even outdoors; a cane only for possible fatigue. He is good with plans for me to return to Haiti at the end of March. There is not a limit to how long I can stay, but he is comfortable with the fact that I usually return in late September. ("Just don't fall again!" Right—like I planned all this!) I can drive again. God is always good, but today I am experiencing it in a new way.
