Many Haitians are waiting for a measure of peace to return. Violent crimes and kidnappings have increased since the beginning of the year. Crime gangs are killing police, and not only mutilating the bodies, but also taking videos of their actions to show their power. I know of two families who have been robbed of everything they own and then pushed out of their houses. Political protests continue, with demands that the president step down. For the past few months, with U.N. approval, he has had committees working on revisions to the constitution so that it more fairly represents all the people. The plan is to submit it to a national vote for approval. However, most people will not vote because of election fraud in the past, as well as facing violence on the way to the polling places.

In such troubled times, Haitian Christians are looking to God for their safety, and for Him to meet their needs. They are also being prudent, not taking unnecessary trips or going outside more than they have to. The clinic staff is seeing established patients twice a week in order to do basic checks and provide medications. Haitians continue to be grateful for your prayers.

Praise The needs for the staff and patients have been met, and they are safe.

There have not been any problems with the clinic property.

I have opportunities for ministry in my home church.

I am making progress on the translation of the discipleship book.

Projects These are on hold for the time being.

Prayer Pastor and Mrs. Baker, my neighbors in Haiti and currently there, have been quite sick. It sounds like they are feeling better, but it could be a month or two before they recover fully. They would like to return to the U.S., but they first want to complete this semester of teaching, and they will have to have a negative COVID test within 72 hours before getting on the plane.

I would like to return to Haiti in June or July when the other missionary neighbors return. Please pray that this will be possible. A blessing is that I have had both COVID vaccination shots.

Jesus said, “...him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out.” (John 6:37) On the cross at Calvary, one of the malefactors, “said unto Jesus, Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom. And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, To day shalt thou be with me in paradise.” (Luke 23:42-43)

Our time is not God’s time. He is patient, giving even the most hardened rebel time to come to Him. It was not too late even for the sinner on the cross to repent and trust in Christ.
